What does and doesn't belong in BIO bins

What happens to the organic waste from BIO bins?

 Biowaste from the bins is taken to composting plants for processing and subsequently returned to the soil in the form of certified compost.

Cleanliness is key

- The building owner or manager is responsible for keeping the bin clean.
- For buildings with a higher number of households, we have bins with lockable lids.
- If the BIO bin contains something that doesn't belong, it won't be picked up.
- A rejected bin is immediately labelled with a sticker with a contact for a collection company.
- You can either remove the inappropriate contents yourself or request an extra pickup at your own expense.
- Repeated misuse of the bin may result in its removal.
